Dear Parents/Guardians of the Class of 2023:

Graduation this year will be on Tuesday, May 30, 2023 at the UWM Panther Arena, 400 W. Kilbourn Avenue at 7:00 p.m. The following includes important information for graduating seniors and their parents.

- 1. There is a Graduation Fee for all graduating seniors.
 - The fee is \$95.00 if paid before March 1, 2023. On March 1, 2023, the fee increases \$10.00 to \$105.00 on March 1, 2023
 - No personal Checks accepted after April 1, 2023
 - Increases another \$15.00 on May 1, 2023.
 - 50% of your Total Fees owed need to be paid one week before Prom Tickets go on sale to be eligible to buy a Prom ticket.

The Senior fee includes:

- Yearbook (\$35.00 value).
- Senior Class Yard Sign (\$10.00).
- Senior Class Celebration/Picnic (\$15.00)
- Rental of the UWM Panther Arena for graduation (\$15.00)
- Graduation tickets and Graduation Program (\$10.00)
- Diploma covers and printing costs (\$10.00)

NOTE: Per MPS District policy **NO PERSONAL CHECKS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER** April 1, 2023. All graduating seniors are responsible for their graduation fees. Fees are to be paid in the Main office. Checks and money orders should be made out to Rufus King High School.

- 2. All graduating seniors must wear a cap and gown to graduation. Caps and gowns <u>are not</u> included in the senior graduation fee and will add approximately \$33.00 (payable to Jostens) to the cost of graduation.

- Orders for Caps & Gowns should already be placed, if your Senior has not done so, please take care of this ASAP
- 3. Dates for distribution of items are as follows:
 - Jostens will distribute caps, gowns, invitations and thank you cards (if ordered) during the lunch periods in the school cafeteria on TBD date.
 - Friday, May 19th, Graduation Rehearsal will be in the school Auditorium after Exams starting at 12:45, Senior Celebration/Picnic Day on the Athletic Field after Rehearsal (1:30 -3:30) College Announcement Day (Yearbooks, Graduation Tickets, Yard Signs, Honor Cords distributed).
- 4. Dates for other activities are as follows:
 - Prom will be on Friday, April 28, 2023 from 6:30 11:00 p.m. Tickets are \$70.00 per person. Location is The Pritzlaff, 333 N. Plankinton Avenue. Theme: Enchanted Garden. Dress code is formal. Students need to be in a sports coat or a formal dress/gown. In order to purchase a ticket, you must have at least half of your outstanding student fees paid. You cannot have any unexcused absences, unserved Tardy Reflections and no suspensions during the 2nd semester.
 - Final Proficiency (Exams) are Friday, May 19th; Monday, May 22nd, and Tuesday, May 23rd.
 - Seniors can drop off textbooks and chrome book to the Library during Exam week (11:00–3:30 p.m.)


Tickets will be sold to Juniors and Seniors. An upper classman may bring an underclassman as their date.

In order to attend, a student must have at least half of their outstanding student fees paid (senior fees/IB fee/unfinished business fees). Students cannot have any unexcused absences, unserved Tardy Reflections and they may not have any suspensions during the Spring 2023 Semester.

Students may bring a pre-approved guest that is a junior or senior from a different high school with the approval of that school's principal. Guests that have graduated from high school must be 19 or younger and have the approval of King administration.

"Prom-posals" are allowed, but not during passing time or class time. They may happen in the lunch hour with the pre-approval of an administrator. Students that violate these rules cause a disruption to the school day and may receive a consequence as severe as losing their ability to attend prom.

Students suspected of being under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be denied entry to prom; their parents will be called to remove them from the dance.





IB EXAMINATION SCHEDULE PUBLISHED/INVIGILATORS NEEDED

Included in this newsletter is the May 2023 IB Examination schedule. Knowing this well in advance can help students plan their work schedules and other activities to accommodate the review they will be doing.

Parents are an important part of the success of our IB testing as they help "invigilate" (IB word for proctor/supervise) the IB tests. Mr. Gatewood is actively recruiting parents to help with the May 2023 invigilating. A person can volunteer for a half day or a full day or more than one day! SCHEDULING OF COURSES IS COMPLETE FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

IB Coordinator Mr. Gatewood visited sophomore English classes in January to inform students about the IB Program and options for their participation in IB classes. The IB program is a two-year program for Junior and Seniors to earn college credits while in high school. Since delivering the International Baccalaureate program is the mission of Rufus King, we expect all regular education juniors and seniors to be involved in at least one IB class each year, with the intent of taking the IB test at the end of each course. Mr. Gatewood also held parent informational meetings in January and, along with the guidance department, assisted students in their course selection in February and March.

2023/24 Common Application Essay Topics

- Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- Reflect on something that someone has done for you that has made you happy or thankful in a surprising way. How has this gratitude affected or motivated you?
- Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.
