IB REGISTRATION INFORMATION FOR MAY 2024 For ALL juniors and seniors taking IB courses

IB registration is currently underway. Registration forms were distributed by Mr. Gatewood in IB English classes during the first week of September. Registration forms are also available under the IB Diploma tab on the Rufus King website: https://schools.milwaukee.k12.wi .us/rufusking/ib/dp/b/dp/ Please sign up as soon as possible; registration closes on October 18th. Students who wish to test pay a \$25.00 testing fee plus a \$62.00 subject fee for each subject. Students who receive free or reduced lunch benefits pay the \$25 registration fee, but do NOT need to pay the \$62 per test fee. The actual cost of the program is greater than is being charged, but MPS subsidizes quite a bit of the fees in order to make this program available to all students. Forms and payments (payable to Rufus King High School) are to be given to Mr. Gatewood (office located in the Library) on or before October 18th 2022 (coincides with Parent Conferences). IB DIPLOMA STUDENT NEWS

As of September 1st, all Full Diploma juniors and seniors have library privileges at UWM's Memorial Library. Students have a loan period of 28 days and have privileges throughout Rufus King's school year. The students are responsible for overdue charges and any damaged or lost book fees, the same as UWM students. In addition, Full Diploma juniors and seniors have access to two significant RKHS library databases, JSTOR and GALE that can assist them on their Extended Essays. Please see our librarian, Ms. Lewandowski at stewarle@milwaukee.k12.wi.us with questions regarding accessing the databases.

There are **75 Full Diploma Juniors (called Anticipated Candidates)** in the Class of 2024. Juniors who are enrolled in IB DP Environmental Science or any IB course they will not be taking next year should plan on testing in those courses. Anticipated Candidates are allowed to take up to two Standard Level tests their junior year.

Full Diploma Seniors will have their next CAS meeting with their advisors in December. They also have a printed schedule of deadlines for completing their Extended Essays. Good performance in their Theory of Knowledge presentation and essay as well as a quality Extended Essay can gain a student up to three extra points on their diploma.





9th grade: scholars will be introduced to the Service as Action component (community service) during their World History classes in November.

10th grade: Did your scholar do any community service over the summer? Encourage them to enter these activities and hours in ManageBac! If they do not remember how to do that, there are directions in the 2026 MYP Resources Google Classroom; look for ManageBac Help at the top of the Classwork tab. The 2026 MYP Resources classroom should appear in your scholar's Google Classrooms; most joined the 9th grade MYP classroom last year--it's the same one, just a new name! If it's not there, join with this code: 7eki5th I will visit all of the 10th grade classes in September to introduce them to the Personal Project. This is a required component of the IB MYP program in 10th grade. All of the information is in the 2026 MYP Resources Classroom (join code: **7eki5th**).

Sophomore year means PERSONAL PROJECT! This is an exciting opportunity for your scholar to: Explore a topic they are passionate about! Create something to demonstrate what they learned! Reflect on their personal growth!



All 9th & 10th grade English classes came to the library for a tour during August/September, where they also had a chance to check out books for independent reading. Books may be exchanged before and after school (7:50-8:00 and 3:25-3:30) or during school with a pass from a teacher. The teacher will call the library first to ensure there is space and someone is available to assist them.
