



IB FULL DIPLOMA CLASS OF 2024 - CREATIVITY, ACTIVITY, SERVICE

Our IB Full Diploma candidates Class of 2024 need to complete all CAS activities and have them approved by their advisors.

Students must upload all activities, reflections and evidence to ManageBac. They also must complete their long-term, self-initiated project that involves collaboration with others. Our IB CAS Coordinator, Ms. Dempsey has distributed a CAS completion checklist to each student to make sure every CAS requirement has been fulfilled. Once all requirements are fulfilled students must schedule an exit interview with their advisor. The absolute deadline to complete all CAS obligations including the face-to-face exit interview is Thursday March 14th in order to retain Full Diploma status. SCHEDULING OF COURSES FOR THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

IB Coordinator Mr. Gatewood visited sophomore English classes in February to inform students about the IB Program and options for their participation in IB classes. The IB program is a two-year program for Junior and Seniors to earn college credits while in high school. Since delivering the International Baccalaureate program is the mission of Rufus King, we expect all regular education juniors and seniors to be involved in at least one IB class each year, with the intent of taking the IB test at the end of each course. Mr. Gatewood also held parent informational meetings in February and, along with the guidance department, assisted students in their course selection. Students who wish to pursue the full diploma must submit their full diploma contract to Mr. Gatewood immediately.

THE EXTENDED ESSAY FOR FULL DIPLOMA CLASS OF 2025 – THE EE AT A GLANCE

The EE is the centerpiece of the IB Diploma Programme. It is an integral and valuable learning experience for all Diploma Programme students.

The aims of the EE are for students to:

- engage in independent research with intellectual initiative and rigor
- develop research, thinking, self-management and communication skills
- reflect on what has been learned throughout the research and writing process.

Choice of topic

The EE is an in-depth study of a focused topic. Students choose their topic from the list of available Diploma Programme subjects for the session in question. For those taking the IB diploma, this is normally one of the student's six chosen subjects. The EE gives students the opportunity to research a topic of their own choice, under the guidance of a supervisor. Students then undertake a major piece of formally presented, structured writing. They communicate their ideas and findings in a reasoned and coherent manner, appropriate to the subject chosen.

All students are required to undertake three reflection sessions with their supervisor. The third is a short, concluding interview, or *viva voce*, following the completion of the essay.

Key features of the EE

The EE is compulsory for all students taking the Diploma. A student must achieve a D grade or higher to be awarded the Diploma. The EE is externally assessed. Together with the grade for theory of knowledge, it contributes up to three points to the total score for the diploma.

The EE process helps prepare students for university and other pathways beyond the Diploma Programme. Students must choose a subject for their essay from the list of Diploma Programme subjects for the session in question. It is presented as a formal piece of sustained academic writing (4,000 words maximum) accompanied by a reflection form (500 words maximum).






